WHO/UNECE Protocol on Water and Health "The objective of this Protocol is to promote at all appropriate levels, ..., the protection of human health and well-being, ..., through improving water management, including the protection of water ecosystems, and through preventing, controlling and reducing waterrelated disease. (Article 1)

Actions



Starting point:

"The Union policy on the environment [...] shall be based on the precautionary principle and on the principles that preventive action should be taken, that environmental damage should as a priority be rectified at source and that the polluter should pay." (Art.191.2 TFEU)
